

## THE RECORD

Things are still stirring among the citizens of Baie d'Urfee. In fact it might be said that the stirring has reached a higher level - a higher level of participation.

Many new people turned up for the last meeting and the Memberships have jumped from 59 to 65 which represents an increase of 10%. At the meeting these persons indicated their enthusiasm for new program ventures as well as for the things which affect their welfare. They discussed at length the possibilities of a new school for the district and concluded that they needed more information about the "ins and outs" of the matter, as it affects their own children and their own municipality. An Education Committee composed of Mrs. Gray, Mrs. Case and Miss Kruse was appointed to study these matters and to represent the Citizens' Association at local School Board Meetings.

It is hoped that it will be possible to secure a prominent speaker from the Protestant Department of Education to clear up points of information at the August meeting.

The problem of the small children on the Station Road getting to the present route of the School Bus will be solved by the bus meeting the children at the Station.

Apparently some people can't get to the meetings for want of Baby Sitters. Judging from the number of small children at Baie d'Urfee Day this is a real problem. Mrs. Fred Grant was given the responsibility of organizing a Baby Sitters' Registry which should help the situation.

The Executive met shortly after the monthly meeting to work out plans to follow up many suggestions. They decided that the presently constituted Recreational and Cultural Committee would have too big a load - so divided this committee into two, with the following appointments: RECREATION - Chairman: Bob McBride, Vice-Chairman: Roy Cape; EDUCATIONAL and CULTURAL: - Chairman: Peter Smith, Vice-Chairman: E.M. DeWitt.

There has been progress with regard to the Veterans Road. The Town Council will take the matter up where the Citizens' Association left off - in the meantime, immediate garbage collection has been arranged.

## BAIE D'URFEE DAY A HUGE SUCCESS

For some 200 Youngsters and Growmups Baie d'Urfee Day will be remembered for some time to come. The first event of its kind to be held within the limits of Baie d'Urfee, the entire programme went off in grand style with more than 65 children taking part.

While the ladies of the Association were busy arranging the tables with all kinds of sandwiches, cakes and cookies, not to mention ice cream the favorite of all, Bob McBride with the help of Mr. Allan and Mrs. Grant got the children organized to take part in Lawn Races.

The first race was for youngsters six years and under, with some 25 girls and boys taking part.

BOB GRANT was FIRST, with CLAIRE ROBILLIARD and PETER FRALICK taking SECOND and THIRD.

Second Race, Seven to Nine, which saw DICK SMYTHE, HEATHER CASE and IRMA WALTERS win the event in the order mentioned.

The weather was overcast and gave every one concerned more ambition to participate and from here all the contestants migrated to the water to take part in the Boating, Swimming and Paddling events.

In the Seven to Nine swimming race, JOHN SPRIGGS out stroked the field to cop the prize.

Next was the 10 to 12 swimming event, this having two winners, DAVE SPRIGGS and JUDY CASE.

In the 13 to 16 swimming event, BEVERLEY GRAHAM took First with HILLARY SPRIGGS a close Second.

The Race for all ages proved to be very popular with many taking part. This race was won by JOHN ALLAN and JO GRANT second.

Giving the swimmers a chance to rest the Rowing Races started for youngsters 7 and under. With a fine exhibition of rowing for Ladies of this age JOHN SPRIGGS led the field with a visitor CHARLIE BONNICI following in Second place.

In the 9 to 12 field, rowing two to a boat, ROBIN ALLAN with IRMA WALTERS led the field across the finishing line with DAVID SPRIGGS and DICK SMYTHE Second.

The course for these events was well laid out and not too far for these willing youngsters. The Rowing Race All Ages had to be held in two heats due to the large number of contestants and in this event the best time clocked governed the Winners.

In the 13 to 16 field HILLARY SPRIGGS took the cake with BEV. GRAHAM Second.

The Paddling Races proved to be the most exciting event of the day with canoes tipping all over the course. To see the way youngsters 9 and over can handle a canoe was really a sight that pleased many a parents eye and gave them full confidence in the ability of their offspring.

The Paddling 9 to 12 Race was won by ROBIN ALLAN and partner IRMA WALTERS, DAVE SPRIGGS and JIMMY WYATT were Second.

In the 13 to 16 Paddle Race, HILLARY SPRIGGS won with JEFF NEWMAN Second.

The all age paddling event saw two canoes turn over to the delight of all on-lookers including cameramen that line the course just waiting for something to happen. Winning the all age was JOHN ALLAN and LOUISE OSBORN, Mr. & Mrs. Doug. LAIRD Second.

The War Canoe Race was won by ALEX SIM and Crew, Mrs. SIM, JIMMY MACDONALD, DOUG. LAIRD and REG. VIDLER. Second place ROY CAPE and Crew.

With all the events over for the younger generation, refreshments were served to keep them occupied while the last events were taking place. The Gunnell Races proved more than a task for many who took part. This feat was very ably won by JOHN ALLAN with DOUG LAIRD Second.

The Tilting Competition was won by JOHN ALLAN and DONALD GRAHAM after battling for quite some time against BEV. GRAHAM and HILLIARY SPRIGGS.

BEV GRAHAM emerged victoriously in the last event, the Grease Pole. The Prize Presentation took place following this event.

It was a grand Show and being the first of its kind, may well be a preview of bigger and better things to come for all of us in Baie d'Urfee.

Our sincere thanks goes out to all who so freely donated their time, effort and ability including all those who joined us for the BIG DAY.
