The regular Monthly Meeting was held on March 12th. at the Town Hall with 30 people in attendance.

Arrangements to have Chimneys swept at a cost of \$1.00 per flue were finalized with citizens being assured of several days notice beforehand.

The Bell Telephone Co. will not service Station Road with equipment until such time as the scrub elm has been removed.

Names appearing on the Service Scroll were read. This list will be posted at the Town Hall for any additions or corrections, after which, the amended Scroll will be completed for the next meeting.

Fact Finding Committee submitted three obligations this Association would be obliged to adhere to, to become a Member of the Montreal Community Council. Since no person is available at the moment to attend that Organizations' regular meetings, which is one of the provisions, it was decided to table this question for the time being.

A competition of Landscapes and Gardens will take place in June and Flowers and Vegetables in August with a Cup being donated for the most points. This competition will come under three groups: Professional, non-professional, and New Homes.

Sale of Home Cooking will take place April 3rd at 3:30 p.m. at the Town Hall.

Larger attendance is requested for the Movie Club.

Following a discussion, a resolution was passed which in effect will ask the Town Council to consider the advisability of amending Building By-Law No. 60 under the appropriate provisions provided under the Cities and Towns Act of the Province of Quebec. Briefly the proposed amendment would regulate type and quality of construction as well as location on a building lot, also the location of the building in relation to the districts and zones to be mapped out under the amendment. The proposed amendment would compel proprietors to submit plans of proposed buildings to a designated officer and obtain a certificate of approval. In addition to this a clause would be included to regulate or prohibit the use of all bridges, viaducts, tunnels, drains, sewers, privies and cesspools within the Municipality and to cause the cleaning or removal of privies and cesspools.

In 1937, he joined the Company as a Soil Chemist and since that time has been engaged primarily in research. Quite naturally, Mr. Snyder is interested in gardening and is also an enthusiastic golfer and fisherman. A larger attendance will be encouraging.
